

## THE CHAPEL FAMILY BIBLE READING PROGRAM – October 26 -31

**MONDAY:** Genesis 1:1-31

**KEY VERSE:** Genesis 1:26

**OBSERVATION:** There are over 900 names for God in the Bible. This week we will look at 7 Powerful Names of God and their meaning. The first name God revealed to us is in the book of Genesis. It is the name **ELOHIM**.. It is in the plural because *God is 3 persons in one* who we refer to as The **Father**, The **Son** and The **Holy Spirit**. Do some research in a concordance or online to find out more information on “ELOHIM”.

**TUESDAY:** Genesis 2:1-25; Psalm 19:1-14

**KEY VERSE:** Psalm 19:14

**OBSERVATION:** In Genesis chapter 2 there are two different Hebrew words that are translated as God. The first word is in verses 1-3 and the second word is in verses 4-25. The second word translated God is the word **YHWH** or **YAHWEH**. This name for God stresses a personal relationship with His people. Is God YAHWEH to you? Do you have a relationship with Him? How would you describe your relationship with Him? 1. COLD. 2. COOL. 3. LUKE WARM. 4. WARM.. 5. HOT AND GLOWING.

**WEDNESDAY:** Genesis 22:1-19

**KEY VERSE:** Genesis 22:8

**OBSERVATION:** Another significant name or description of God is found in Genesis 22:8. It is the word **JEHOVAH JIREH**. It means *God will provide*. Just as God provided a lamb for Abraham He also provided a Lamb for us in the person of Jesus Christ. Do you trust God to provide for you physically, spiritually, financially, relationally? Is He Jehovah Jireh to you?

**THURSDAY:** Psalm 91:1-16; Genesis 17:1; 28:3, 35:11

**KEY VERSE:** Psalm 91:1-2

**OBSERVATION:** **EL** is a part of God's name and when you add **SHADDIA** you are literally saying *God Almighty*. This expresses the Omnipotence of God. When Abraham and Sarah were past child-bearing age God told them “I AM ALMIGHTY GOD. As a matter of fact God is ALMIGHTY in every circumstance. Do you allow Him to be ALMIGHTY IN YOUR LIFE?

**FRIDAY:** Romans 5:1; John 3:36; Romans 8:1; James 4:6

**KEY VERSE:** Romans 5:1

**OBSERVATION:** Our Lord and Savior is also **JEHOVAH SHALOM**. The Lord is Peace. Jesus taught and demonstrated to His disciples that they could have peace even in the midst of a violent storm. We can experience peace with God and we can also experience the peace of God in our lives. Do you have both?

**SATURDAY:**John 10:3-4; Psalm 23:1-6; John 7:37-39

**KEY VERSE:**Psalm 23:1

**OBSERVATION:** **JEHOVAH ROHI**. The Lord is my SHEPHERD. This is the name given by David when he wrote Psalm 23. Do you allow God to be your Shepherd or do you find yourself going astray. Are you a part of the 99 sheep who followed the Shepherd or have you been walking alone?
