Doing Life Together – Threads of Thrive – Compassion

MONDAY:

KEY VERSE: Hebrews 4:12

OBSERVATION: God is a real person who is speaking to us through the Bible as we read it. It has power like no other book because the author is using it to speak directly to our hearts as we are reading it. It is also different from any other book because it was written by the One who created us, so it can answer our deepest needs like no other book.

TUESDAY:

KEY VERSE: Matthew 6:19-21

OBSERVATION: Most of us would consider it an unwise investment to pour a lot of money into a phone we would only have for a few days. Likewise, since our life here on earth is so short compared to eternity in heaven, it makes a lot more sense to store up our treasures in heaven where they will last for eternity.

WEDNESDAY:

KEY VERSE: 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

OBSERVATION: Some possible questions include: On a scale of 1-10, how would you rank your desire to know God personally? At this point in your life, do you think you're moving closer to God, further away, or staying the same? What kind of spiritual background do you have? If you could ask God one question, what would it be?

THURSDAY:

KEY VERSE: Ephesians 2:1-10

OBSERVATION: Dead in our sin. Following the ways of the world, following the ruler of the world, or Satan. Disobedient as the spirit of the world worked in us. Objects of wrath. What does this passage say about us after we come to know Christ? He made us alive. He raised us up and seated us with Christ. He saved us out of his great love for us and to show us the riches of his grace. We only have to place our trust in Christ; He has done the rest as a gift, not because of anything we have done.

FRIDAY:

KEY VERSE: 1 Corinthians 5:21

OBSERVATION: Christ exchanged our sin for his righteousness. Righteousness means that we have been made pure and holy and given a right standing or relationship with God. Because of what Christ has done, we are fully clean and fully accepted to come into God's holy presence.

SATURDAY:

KEY VERSE: John 15:5

OBSERVATION: God gives us the analogy of us being the branches and God being the vine. If we are disconnected, just like a vine in real life, we cannot bear fruit or good things? If we are not connected to God through prayer, church/fellowship and the Word, how can we possibly prosper spiritually as Christians? Get Connected ... and not on the Weekend. The Vine analogy also says that we cannot be alive if we are connected just once and a while.
